

### Mozart & Haydn October 8, 2017



John O'Brien Fortepiano

A perfect fortepiano for Mozart! The season opens with the sparkling music of Mozart and Haydn, played on a 1784 Stein replica fortepiano — an instrument rich in clarity and dynamism, one that Mozart loved. John O'Brien is featured, with violinist Leah Peroutka and cellist Stephanie Vial.

The program includes Mozart's Piano Trio (K.496) and Violin Sonata (K.305), along with Haydn's A-major Piano Trio and a sonata for cello by Anton Kraft, Haydn's cellist.

### Bach: Wachet Auf January 14, 2018



Steven Kimbrough Baritone

Baritone Steven Kimbrough is featured in arias from Bach's famous cantata Wachet Auf and in songs from a 1736 Bach collection. Kimbrough was a leading baritone of the Bonn Opera in Germany, has concertized all over the world, and is featured on numerous recordings. He is joined by soprano Florence Peacock and a small baroque instrumental ensemble.
